Abstract

This study determined the factors of absenteeism among the 100 Business students at John B. Lacson Colleges Foundation-Molo, Inc., during the first semester of school-year, 2006-2007. Descriptive method was used which also utilized descriptive data analysis which included frequency counts, percentages, and ranks. Results of the study revealed that the most dominant factors of absenteeism are the personal-related factors, where "Lazy to wake-up early in the morning" was identified by the participants as the topmost reason. The least dominant factor among the personal-related factors was "Have a date with girlfriend/boyfriend". School-related factors were viewed as the least dominant among the four general factors. In this cluster, the most dominant was "Class schedule is not properly arranged", while the least dominant was "The class size is too large".
