

Teaching Competence of Tourism Instructors as  
Perceived by the Students at  
JBLCF - Molo Inc.

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### Abstract

The purpose of this study was to determine the level of teaching competence of tourism instructors as perceived by the students at John B. Lacson Colleges Foundation Molo-Inc. for the school year 2004- 2005. The data of this descriptive research were gathered through the use of thirty six (36) item rating scale known as "Instructors Evaluation Form" which was adopted by the researchers. The respondents of the study were 67 tourism students. To statistically analyze the data, the means and standard deviation were employed as descriptive statistics. The study revealed that the tourism students' perception of their instructors' competence was "very good" when classified as an entire group. The study also revealed that when the respondents are classified according to year level, home location, status of residence, and monthly family income, they perceived their instructors' competence as "very good" except for the fourth year students and

those with low monthly family income who had only "good" perception of their teachers' competence.
